Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with all supervisors present: Bardole, Burkett, Contner, Muir, Rudolph. Motion by Rudolph, second by Bardole to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Burkett, second by Contner to approve the minutes of February 13, 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisor Dawn Rudolph gave a short report of a Freedom Rock committee meeting she attended.

Larry Teeples encouraged the board to continue its membership with the U.S. Highway 30 Coalition by paying dues and participating in phone conference calls and other meetings. The coalition promotes improvements and expansion of Highway 30 across Iowa, specifically rural four-lanes. Teeples encouraged support for expansion of the highway to four lanes from Ogden to Carroll. Supervisor Mick Burkett is the county's representative to the Highway 30 Coalition.

Treasurer Katlynn Mechaelsen shared her monthly report with the board. Motion by Bardole, second by Burkett to accept the Treasurer's Investment and Driver's License Report for January. Motion carried unanimously.

Jerry Brown of SCL communications was present to share information with the board about the proposed security enhancements, specifically security cameras and keycard locks, for the courthouse. Brown introduced Adam Ring of SCL via phone/video meeting, who reviewed key benefits and capabilities of the system proposed in the installation agreement to be considered by the supervisors. The hour-long presentation included information about the services, support, training, server information, licensing and controls. Brown then answered questions from those present. The board will consider the installation agreement after final review by county attorney Thomas Laehn, tentatively scheduled for next week's board meeting.

Muir adjourned the meeting at 10:45 a.m.
